## Review of last lesson: Genesis 3:1-6

### 1. The Tempter (3:1-5)

- A. The identity of the enemy – eventually revealed as Satan
- B. The tactics of the enemy
  - 1) He disguises himself
  - 2) He questions God's Word
  - 3) He denies God's Word
  - 4) He substitutes his own lie
    - He minimizes the consequences of sin
    - He maximizes the supposed benefits of sin

### 2. The Temptation (3:6)

The root of sin is distrust and disobedience.

- A. "good for food" – "desires of the flesh"
- B. "a delight to the eyes" – "desires of the eyes"
- C. "to be desired to make one wise" – "pride of life"

Temptation is often an opportunity to accomplish a good thing in a bad way.

Note: Even though the devil is involved in tempting us, we are responsible for our response.

- C. Possible \_\_\_\_\_ for forgiveness of sins (3:21) – Isaiah 61:10
- D. Prevention of living \_\_\_\_\_ in a fallen state (3:22-24)
