- Date: Approximately AD 65
- Recipients: Primarily <u>Jewish</u> Christians
- Purpose: To warn believers to be vigilant about
 <u>false</u> teachers, and to remain
 <u>strong</u> in the faith

Content of Jude & Application

- 1. Greeting (1-2)
 - Application: Take time to rejoice in God's <u>call</u>, <u>love</u> and keeping power.
- 2. Purpose of Letter (3-4)
 - A. Appeal: <u>Contend</u> for the faith
 - B. Warning: False teachers have <u>crept</u> into the church
 - 1) They are <u>ungodly</u>. <u>Unrighteous</u>, lawless, disobedient, lacking respect for God
 - They use the grace of God as an excuse for <u>sexual</u> immorality.

Application: God's grace provides for <u>forgiveness</u> of sin, but not an <u>excuse</u> for sin.
