## Background

•	Author: <u>Jude</u>
	Matthew 13:55; Acts 1:14; 1 Corinthians 9:5

- Date: Approximately AD 65
- Recipients: Primarily <u>Jewish</u> Christians
- Purpose: To warn believers to be vigilant about
  <u>false</u> teachers, and to remain
  <u>strong</u> in the faith

## **Content of Jude & Application**

- 1. Greeting (1-2)
  - Application: Take time to rejoice in God's <u>call</u>, <u>love</u> and keeping power.
- 2. Purpose of Letter (3-4)
  - A. Appeal: <u>Contend</u> for the faith
  - B. Warning: False teachers have <u>crept</u> into the church
    - 1) They are <u>ungodly</u>. <u>Unrighteous</u>, lawless, disobedient, lacking respect for God
    - 2) They use the grace of God as an excuse for <a href="mailto:sexual">sexual</a> immorality.
      Application: God's grace provides for

<u>forgiveness</u> of sin, but not an excuse for sin.

- 3) Thy deny the <u>nature</u> and authority of Jesus Christ.
- Description and Condemnation of Corrupt Teachers (5-19)
  - A. 3 Old Testament examples of God's judgment on <u>rebellion</u> (5-7)

- 1) Israel rebelled through lack of \_\_\_\_\_\_ Numbers 14
- 2) Angels rebelled by leaving their assigned
  <u>positions</u> 1 Enoch, Genesis 6:1-4,
  2 Peter 2:4
- 3) Men of Sodom rebelled through \_\_\_\_\_\_\_\_ immorality Genesis 18-19
- B. The false teachers will be judged for doing the <u>same</u> things (8-10)
  - 1) They are <u>sexually</u> immoral
  - 2) They reject <u>authority</u>
  - 3) They slander <u>celestial</u> beings
- C. 3 more Old Testament examples of rebels who were judged (11-13)
  - 1) Cain (Genesis 4) Just as Cain did not <u>care</u> for his brother, the false teachers did not <u>care</u> about their followers.
  - Balaam (Numbers 22-25 & 31:16) Just as Balaam led God's people into immorality and idolatry because of <u>greed</u>, the false teachers were motived by <u>financial</u> gain.
  - Korah (Numbers 16) Just as Korah rebelled against God's divinely appointed leaders, wanting power for himself, the false teachers <u>opposed</u> the apostles and church leaders.
