### Introduction

Exodus 33:13, 18

**Text: Exodus 34:5-7**

### God revealed Himself as being “slow to anger.”

- Being “**slow** to anger” indicates that God is \_\_\_\_\_.
  - A synonym of “slow to anger” is \_\_\_\_\_ - \_\_\_\_\_. (Proverbs 16:32)
  - God wants people to \_\_\_\_\_ because He values restoration over condemnation. (Romans 2:4; 2 Peter 3:9)
- “Slow to **anger**” indicates that God \_\_\_\_\_ get angry ... and does something about it!  
The Bible mentions God’s wrath more than \_\_\_\_\_ times.  
Psalm 7:11-12
  - Sometimes God’s judgment comes in this \_\_\_\_\_; but if not, there will be a day of reckoning.
